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October 23, 2018 Shuffleboard Abacus Scoring

Your abacus scoring units (2) arrived with the proper number of scoring discs.

There are two black and nine silver discs on one abacus, and two red and nine silver discs on the other abacus as shown below. Each of two players (or teams) uses either the red or black abacus discs to score to 21.

To score, start with all 11 discs pushed to one end. Start Scoring with the colored disc first. For each point earned, slide the discs to the other end of the abacus. All 11 discs at the opposite end of the abacus would mean a score of 11 points.

At 11 points earned, move one colored disc and the nine silver discs back to the other end of the abacus, leaving the other colored disc alone at one end. That single disc now represents 11 points earned.

As additional points are earned, slide the remaining nine silver discs and the remaining colored disc toward the single colored disc. Sliding those remaining 10 discs (1 colored, 9 silver) toward the single colored disk will result in 21 points when all discs are pushed to the opposite end.





Same concept applies to the wooden embedded abacus.
